#### 399th Anniversary of the First Poles in America

On Monday, October 1, 2007, Polish Americans marked the 399th Anniversary of the arrival of the first Polish settlers to America at Jamestown, Virginia in 1608. A reception was held at the Polish American Cultural Center Museum, 308 Walnut Street in historic Philadelphia, to celebrate the occasion.



During the reception, a duplicate of the plaque at

Jamestown, VA, donated by the Polish Falcons of America for the 350th Anniversary in 1958, was displayed at the museum, courtesy of Ben Stefanski, President of the Polish Cultural Center in Cleveland, Ohio, Dorothy Gajewski, and the Polish American Heritage Association of Berks County.

Historian Dorothy Gajewski saw the original plaque in Jamestown, VA. She inquired if the Polish American Heritage Association of Berks County could borrow the plaque for a short time. Since this was not possible, the museum director at Jamestown, Joe Gutierrez, came up with a plan to make duplicates. Ben Stefanski underwrote the production of two plaques, one for his organization in Cleveland and another for Gajewski's organization in Berks County. The plaques are to be displayed throughout the country for the 400th Anniversary of the arrival of the first Polish settlers at Jamestown. Dorothy Gajewski notified the Cultural Center of one plaque's availability for the Cultural Center Museum, which is presently being displayed.
