

Poetry Reading of Jan Kochanowski a Success



On Friday, November 2, 2007, the Kosciuszko Foundation Philadelphia Chapter and the Overbrook Poets, in conjunction with the Polish American Cultural Center Museum at 308 Walnut Street, Philadelphia, sponsored readings by fourteen poets of the poetry of Jan Kochanowski. Jan Kochanowski, born in 1530, was the greatest pre-Romantic writer in Poland and all of Slavdom, known as "the father of Polish poetry." He was the author of the Dismissal of the Greek Envoys, the first Polish drama that dealt with Poland's contemporary political problems under the literary guise of Greek antiquity. A subtle and accomplished artist as well as the creator of Polish poetry and of the Polish literary language, Kochanowski was the most universal representative of Poland's Renaissance culture.

Compliments are extended to the coordinators of the event, Katarzyna Newcomer, Teresa Wojcik, President of the Kosciuszko Foundation, Philadelphia Chapter, and the Polish American Cultural Center Museum volunteers for a successful presentation.

"Katyn"

A book entitled "Katyn" was released September 3rd, two weeks before the premiere of Andrzej Wajda's film with the same title. The album contains photographs, archive documents and reproductions of historical maps that can serve as an introduction to the film. The album also contains stills from the set of Wajda's film and personal commentaries by the Oscar-winning director.

Wajda, whose father was killed in Katyn, says the film is a story of the Katyn lie. For years the fact of the murder committed against Poles by Stalin's NKVD secret services was denied and the blame put on Nazis. Katyn is the first feature film about the 1940 execution of 22,000 Polish civilians and officers by the NKVD.

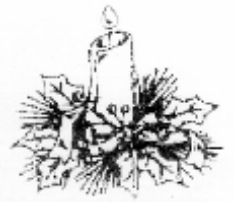
