Alex Wolszczan Polish American Astronomer Finds Earth-Like Planet

A planet outside our solar system with a year roughly equal to Earth's has been discovered around a dying, red giant star. The finding, which was detailed in the November 2007 issue of Astrophysical Journal, was made by a team led by Penn State astronomer Alex Wolszczan. In 1992, Mr. Wolszczan discovered the first planets outside our solar system around a deadly, radiation-spewing star.



Library Honors Historian Ed Dybicz



The Upper Merion Township Library Board presented its "2007 Library Friend of the Year" award to Historian Ed Dybicz of Swedesburg, PA at ceremonies in the Township Administration Conference Room.

The award was presented by chairlady Susan Lomax and Library Director Carl Helicher in recognition and appreciation of Dybicz's service to the library. The library is the depository for hundreds of articles written by Dybicz, who spent 35 years as a correspondent for the Norristown Times Herald.

A veteran of World War II, European Theatre Operations, Dybicz has written articles on local history. His research led to the placing of General Pulaski's name on the list of Washington's officers on the National Memorial Arch at Valley Forge National Historic Park in 1950.

Recently Dybicz was awarded the Distinguished Service Award of the Upper Merion Park and Historical Foundation and the Legion of Honor of the Chapel of the Four Chaplains of the United States.

Dybicz is a member of Sacred Heart Church, Swedesburg; Veteran of Foreign Wars Post 840, Bridgeport; DAV Post 24 of Norristown; 44th Infantry Division Association; Historical Society of Montgomery County, PA; Valley Forge Historical Society; Life Member Swedesburg Fire Co., and the Mlotkowski Brigade Society of Fort Delaware.

In 2005, the Upper Merion Township Board of Supervisors during History Week honored Dybicz as "Mr. Upper Merion History."

Christopher Raiczyk, son of Polka Drummer Stan Raiczyk and his wife, Terry, from Bellmawr, NJ, and a student at St. Francis de Sales School, was accepted into the People World Leadership Forum. Raiczyk joined a select group of students in Washington, DC, September 17-23, 2007, to earn high school credit while studying leadership and exploring some of the United States' most prominent monuments and institutions.

From Capitol Hill to the Smithsonian Institution and from Colonial Williamsburg to the National Museum of American History, Raiczyk examined the characteristics of American leadership during times of national challenge and prosperity. Forum delegates also participated in small group discussions and exercises to experience first-hand how successful leaders develop strategies, make decisions, build consensus, and foster change.

The program was coordinated by People to People Student Ambassador Programs to fulfill the vision of Dwight D. Eisenhower for fostering world citizenship when he founded People to People during his presidency in 1956.
