Polonia Bids Farewell to Irena Sendler

Irena Sendler, a remarkable woman who
defied the Nazis during World War II and
saved 2,500 Jewish children from death
by smuggling them out of the Warsaw
Ghetto, died at the age of 98, on Monday,
May 12, 2008, in Warsaw, Poland. She had
pneumonia.



She was arrested, imprisoned by
the Gestapo and sentenced to death in
1943. Withstanding torture by the Gestapo,
who broke her feet and legs, she did not
betray any of her associates or the children
in hiding. She was saved from death when
Zegota, an underground Polish rescue group,
bribed one of the Germans to halt the execution.
She continued working under a false
identity.

She was awarded the title of "Righteous Among the Nations"
by the Yad Vashem organization in Jerusalem in 1965 and made
an honorary citizen of Israel in 1991. In October, 2003, she
was honored with the Jan Karski Freedom Award for Valor and
Compassion and on November of that same year was awarded
Poland's highest distinction, the Order of White Eagle, in Warsaw.
Both President Lech Kaczynski and Israeli Prime Minister Ehud
Olmert have submitted her candidacy for the Nobel Peace Prize.
