Congratulations Joseph A. Drobot, Jr.

On Saturday, May 16, 2015, Joseph A. Drobot, Jr., National President of the Polish Roman Catholic Union of America, (PRCUA), was awarded the Haller Swords Medal by PAVA Post 152. The award ceremony took place at the Polish American Cultural Center in Cleveland, OH, during the 80th Anniversary Celebration of the Polish Army Veterans Association (PAVA) Tadeusz Kosciuszko Post 152, Inc.

The Haller Swords Medal was originally awarded to World War I soldiers from America and Canada, who joined the Polish Army in France and fought under the command of General Jozef Haller. Later the PAVA (SWAP - Stowarzyszenie Weteranow Armii Polskiej) conferred this decoration upon civilians who work closely with PAVA and Polonia.

Visit "The Kosciuszko Room"

During the summer months, or anytime throughout the year, visit the Kosciuszko Room in Ansonia, CT.

The Kosciuszko Room, established in 1980 by Joseph Wardzala, who devoted more than 50 years of his life studying the life and accomplishments of General Thaddeus Kosciuszko, and sponsored by the Kosciuszko Historical Society of Ansonia, Derby, Shelton and Seymour, is located on the second floor in the historic General David Humphreys House, 37 Elm Street, Ansonia, CT.

While in the United States, Kosciuszko befriended General Humphreys and spent much time in his home.

The Kosciuszko Room displays many artifacts honoring General Kosciuszko, including photographs, books, portraits, dolls dressed in traditional Polish dress, and a letter written by Humphreys to Kosciuszko in 1791. It is open, admission free, Monday through Friday, from 1 to 4 p.m., September through June, 9 A.M. to 12 Noon, July and August, or by appointment by calling Joseph Wardzala at 203-732-5886.
